**Subject:** Thrift Savings Plan Booklet *Information About Court Orders*

**Date:** July 9, 2003

The Federal Retirement Thrift Investment Board has revised the booklet *Information About Court Orders* to reflect the changes resulting from the implementation of the new, daily valued record keeping system (e.g., court-ordered payments may be disbursed every business day). A copy of this revision, dated June 2003, is attached to this bulletin.

The court order booklet contains information about court orders in the context of the Thrift Savings Plan (TSP). It explains how to submit a court order and how a court order is evaluated by the TSP.

**Service responsibilities.** Services should provide the court order booklet to participants or attorneys who ask about court-ordered TSP payments in connection with a divorce, annulment, or legal separation. Representatives from each central distribution point may order copies of the booklet from the TSP by completing the Thrift Savings Plan Publications Order Form (TSP-U-40). The booklet is also available from the TSP Web site at [www.tsp.gov](http://www.tsp.gov).
